Headteacher's Message

Dear Parent/Carer,

What a difference the sunshine makes! It finally feels like Summer has arrived and the children are happy that they can now use the school field over the lunchtime period. 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Dear Parent/Carer

The entitlement criteria for automatic payments from the Household Support Fund is changing

In order to be entitled to a payment from the Household Support Fund scheme in 2024, you must be responsible for at least one child and on 3rd June 2024 either:

- Be entitled to Council Tax Support or
- Have been placed in emergency accommodation by the Council.

Payments will continue to be made at £80 per child. If you are already in receipt of Council Tax Support, then you do not have to do anything else – you will receive your payment automatically.

It is important that you submit your application by 31st May 2024.

You may also be entitled to help from the Household Support Fund via one of the Household Support Fund partners. Their details can be found here <https://www.cornwall.gov.uk/benefits-and-support/household-support-fund/>

Why has the Council made this change?

Because entitlement to Free School Meals has been protected since 2018, parents of children who are entitled to free school meals aren't always still on a low income. By using the Council's Tax Support data, they can ensure that the Household Support Fund awards are going to parents who currently have a low income and are struggling with the increased costs of running their home. By better targeting the awards, the Council are able to help families with children of any age, rather than just school age children.

Families of children in receipt of free school meals can still access help through the Time2Move holiday programme. This scheme offers fun physical activities, games and wider activities plus a meal for all children during the main school holiday periods.

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Sixth Form PE students visit to Marjon University

On Monday 22nd April, Miss Rowe took 9 of our Sixth Form students to Plymouth Marjon University to take part in some workshops alongside their studies. The students were given access to the university's fitness testing facilities and conducted some fitness testing on each other. This included testing their power, speed, body composition and muscular strength.

The students were also given the opportunity to use their anti-gravity treadmill to see how people with injuries, particularly of the lower limbs, can strengthen their muscles to return to exercise. Holly was fortunate enough to use the treadmill to feel what it was like walking on the moon.

The students then took part in an one hour sports rehabilitation workshop where they learnt about the 5 stages to rehabilitating an injury. They were then given a time limit to think about an injury and exercises they would suggest for an injured client.

It was a valuable day for our students and an exciting opportunity to use Marjon's facilities and learn from the expertise of the staff at the university. I know the students really enjoyed the day. Thank you to the staff at Plymouth Marjon University for allowing us to attend the workshops and for helping out students with their studies.

On Sunday 28th April, 40 students attended a trip to watch a Women's Super League football match between Bristol City and Manchester City.

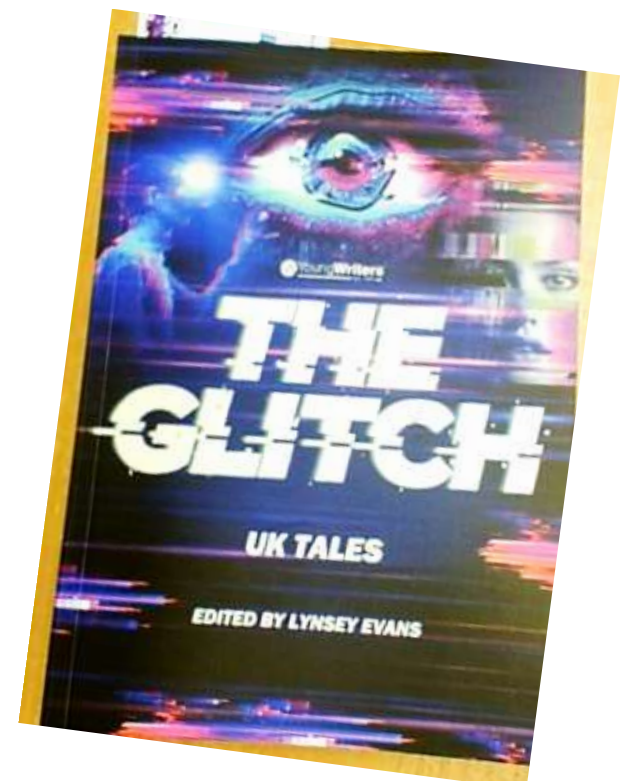

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Thanckes Park tennis courts reopen after renovation

Park tennis courts in Torpoint have been officially reopened after a £60,000 renovation, managed by the LTA and Torpoint Town Council with funds from DCMS within UK Government, LTA Tennis Foundation, Torpoint Town Council and Local Donations.

Tennis courts Thanckes Park hosted a ceremony attended by Mayor Gary Davis and MP Sheryll Murray, along with representatives from the LTA and Torpoint Town Council. There was an opportunity for people from the local community to pick up a racket and get on court and try the tennis courts for the first time. Refreshments were provided in Bénodet Park which included a fantastic cake courtesy of Cornish Pod with help from Print Options LTD and Awenek Studio CIC.

Through the Parks Tennis Project, the LTA is delivering the biggest ever investment in parks tennis facilities across Britain, which has been used to bring back to use 2 courts in Thanckes Park, Torpoint, providing a significant boost to sporting facilities in the town.

The courts have undergone extensive work to ensure viability for years to come, including resurfacing, repainting, new nets and gate system. An appropriate accessible pathway has also been installed to court 1 to enable wheelchair users to enjoy games of tennis. This nationwide programme of investment is seeing thousands of existing park tennis courts in poor or unplayable condition brought back to life for the benefit of communities across the country, providing vital opportunities for children and adults to get active.

Weekly free park tennis sessions are planned in the future, with equipment provided, the new courts will host Local Tennis Leagues, giving people the opportunity to get involved in friendly and social local competitions.

The tennis courts will be available to book via the LTA website. New booking systems and gate access technology means it is now easier to get on court by booking in advance to guarantee availability.

The courts have an affordably priced annual pass (£35 per household per annum with no further charge) or a one off of price of £6 to book a court. The income is secured to ensure that the courts are maintained at their new high standard for years to come. The LTA, Torpoint Town Council will now work together to ensure coaching sessions in the park are available on the courts providing regular opportunities for anyone to pick up a racket and play.

Torpoint Town Council is also looking for local people to deliver a free tennis session for local people at the weekends. If you are interested in becoming a volunteer for 'Free Park Tennis' activator, please see further details on the LTA website.

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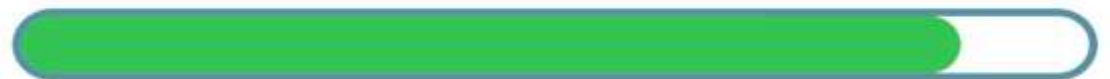

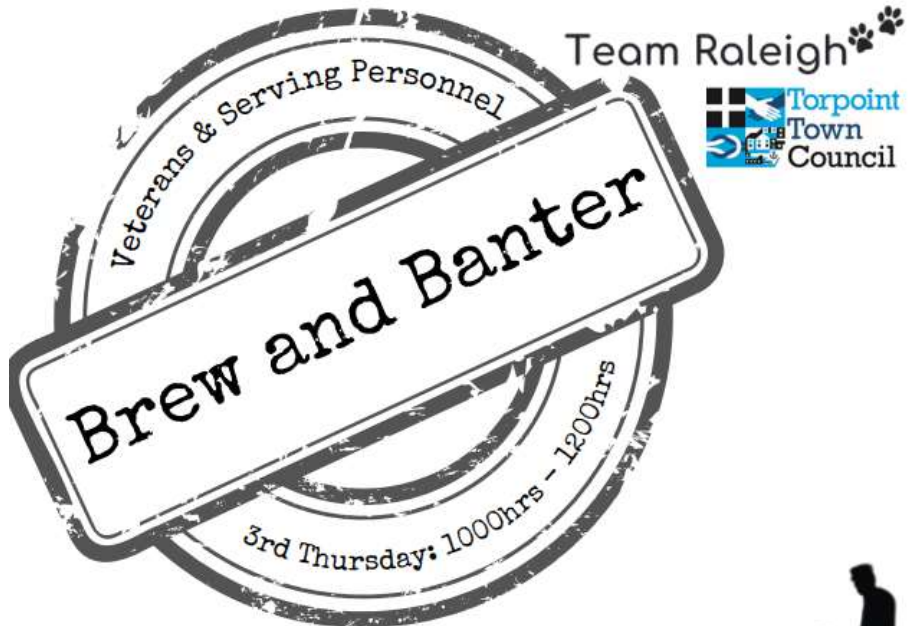
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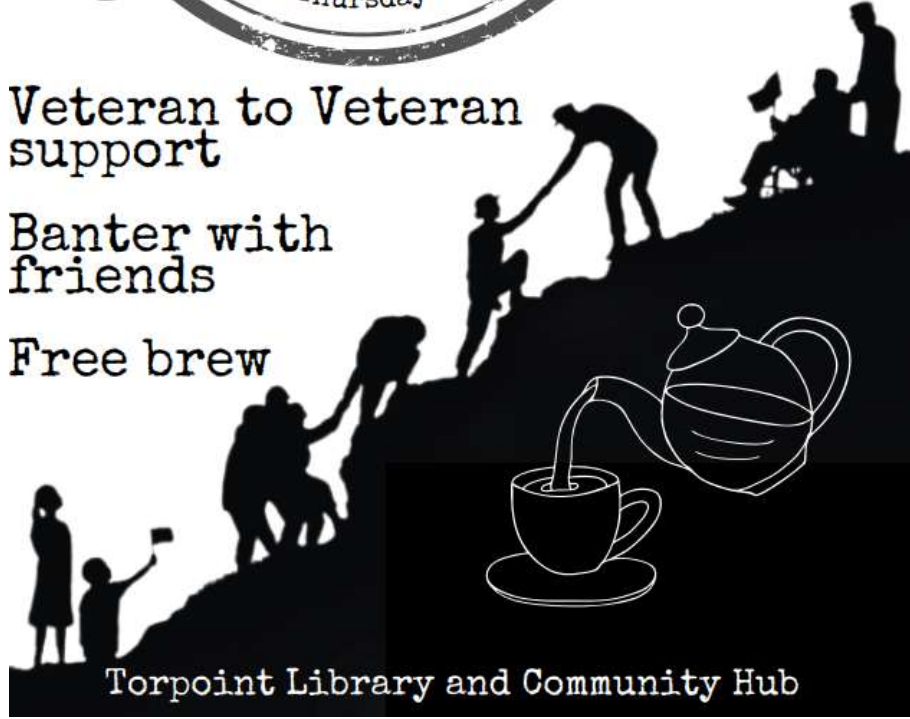
