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Bernie Graham's Visit

This term students have been completing studying twentieth century history in Year 9. Students have been learning about the causes, events and consequences of the Holocaust, including the reasons for and long-term history of antisemitism, both in Europe and the UK. It is important to remember that beyond the frightening statistics of 6 million people being murdered, including 1.5 million children, each victim had a story to tell; mothers and fathers, brothers and sisters, cousins, girlfriends and boyfriends; wives, husbands and friends.

Torpoint Community College has framed the study of the Holocaust around an investigative project into learning about the lives of the Federmann family. Students worked as 'archivists', analysing a variety of sources, reading these closely and sorting by family members. Students found out that during the Holocaust experiences were different and individual. Often, it was luck that could mean the difference between survival and death.

Soloman Federmann's grandson Bernie Graham, who has appeared on the BBC Documentary, "My Family, The Holocaust and Me" with Rob Rinder, was kind enough to come into school on Friday 5th July to discuss his experiences of visiting Germany and learning about the involvement of his parents and grandparents, and families during the Holocaust. Bernie took many questions from Year 9 students, which led to an informative and emotional discussion around the topic.

Students reflected that it is important that we continue to remember the past. Mr Truan, Mr Miller, Mr Ayles and Mr Richardson would like to thank Bernie for taking time to come into the College to support the discussions that have taken place within History lessons this term.






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Parents Plus Adolescents Programme
